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WEEK 1 | OVERVIEW

Purpose

When I was in the UK, my brother and I overheard one girl say to another: "I've been to Glastonbury 3x2" We laughed and thought: "Why not just say she'd been 6 times?" From then one, whenever anyone said anything a bit dense we'd say: "I've been to Glastonbury 3x2" in our best mean girls accents.

Years later, our sister pointed out that the girl was probably saying that she'd been to Glastonbury three times as well!

Three times too! It turned out we were the idiots all along!

That's the book of Malachi. Malachi exposes the folly of God's people and calls them to repent in preparation for the coming day of the Lord. He says: "You've got it all wrong. Get over yourselves, stop sulking, trust me, and do what's right!"

Structure

In terms of structure, there seems to be six disputations between God and the people followed by a summary statement about what God requires of them, and the coming messianic messenger. The bible project summary video is pretty useful when it comes to overall structure.

Context

Malachi preached a generation or two after Zechariah, around 460-430BC). At this point, the Temple is built and Nehemiah has just put the finishing touches on the walls of Jerusalem.



Just like Zechariah's hearers, the people are discouraged and drifting from God. They were promised a post-exilic golden age but are experiencing a drought due to their disobedience to the covenant.

The presenting issues may seem distant—neglect of the temple, contempt for the sacrifices, unfaithfulness in marriage, injustice in the land—but they are not far from any of us. It's all about spiritual dryness leading to ungodliness—a timeless struggle that presents itself in different ways. It's a confronting book but in the end holds out a message of hope and comfort because God chooses to love them and us despite ourselves.

I'm confident that God's word to them then, will speak to us now, with the freshness and immediacy of God's Spirit.

2 "I have loved you," says the Lord.

"Was not Esau Jacob's brother?" declares the Lord. "Yet I have loved Jacob, 3 but Esau I	
have hated, and I have turned his hill country	
into a wasteland and left his inheritance to the desert jackals."	
4 Edom may say, "Though we have been	
crushed, we will rebuild the ruins."	
But this is what the Lord Almighty says: "They may build, but I will demolish. They will be	
called the Wicked Land, a people always un-



DISPUTATION 2 | CONTEMPT

Read Malachi 1:6-2:9

Trodd Fraccom Tr	0 2.0
6 "A son honors his father, and a slave his master. If I am a father, where is the honor due me? If I am a master, where is the respect due me?" says the Lord Almighty.	
"It is you priests who show contempt for my name. "But you ask, 'How have we shown contempt for your name?' 7 "By offering defiled food on my altar. "But you ask, 'How have we	
defiled you?' "By saying that the Lord's table is contemptible. 8 When you offer blind animals for sacrifice, is that not wrong? When you sacrifice lame or diseased animals, is that not wrong? Try offering them to your governor! Would he be pleased with you? Would he ac-	
cept you?" says the Lord Almighty. 9 "Plead with God to be gracious to us. With such offerings from your hands, will he accept you?"—says the Lord Almighty.	
10 "Oh, that one of you would shut the temple doors, so that you would not light useless fires on my altar! I am not pleased with you," says	
the Lord Almighty, "and I will accept no offer- ing from your hands. 11 My name will be great among the nations, from where the sun rises to where it sets. In every place in-	
cense and pure offerings will be brought to me, because my name will be great among the na-	

tions," says the Lord Almighty.

12 "But you profane it by saying, 'The Lord's table is defiled,' and, 'Its food is contemptible.' 13 And you say, 'What a burden!' and you sniff at it contemptuously," says the Lord Almighty.

"When you bring injured, lame or diseased animals and offer them as sacrifices, should I accept them from your hands?" says the Lord.

14 "Cursed is the cheat who has an acceptable male in his flock and vows to give it, but then sacrifices a blemished animal to the Lord. For I am a great king," says the Lord Almighty, "and my name is to be feared among the nations.

2:1 "And now, you priests, this warning is for you. 2 If you do not listen, and if you do not resolve to honor my name," says the Lord Almighty, "I will send a curse on you, and I will curse your blessings. Yes, I have already cursed them, because you have not resolved to honor me.

3 "Because of you I will rebuke your descendants; I will smear on your faces the dung from your festival sacrifices, and you will be carried off with it. 4 And you will know that I have sent you this warning so that my covenant with Levi may continue," says the Lord Almighty. 5 "My covenant was with him, a covenant of life and peace, and I gave them to him; this called for reverence and he revered me and stood in awe of my name. 6 True instruction was in his mouth and nothing false was found on his lips. He walked with me in peace and uprightness, and turned many from sin.

7 "For the lips of a priest ought to preserve knowledge, because he is the messenger of the Lord Almighty and people seek instruction from his mouth. 8 But you have turned from the way and by your teaching have caused many to stumble; you have violated the covenant with Levi," says the Lord Almighty. 9 "So I have caused you to be despised and humiliated before all the people, because you have not followed my ways but have shown partiality in matters of the law."

DISPUTATION 3—UNFAITHFULNESS

Personal time in Malachi 2:10-16

¹⁰ Do we not all have one Father? Did not one God create us? Why do we profane the covenant of our ancestors by being unfaithful to one another?	
¹¹ Judah has been unfaithful. A detestable thing has been committed in Israel and in Jerusalem: Judah has desecrated the sanctuary the LORD loves by marrying women who worship a foreign god. ¹² As for the man who does	
this, whoever he may be, may the LORD remove him from the tents of Jacob— even though he brings an offering to the LORD Almighty.	
¹³ Another thing you do: You flood the LORD's altar with tears. You weep and wail because he no longer looks with favor on your offerings or accepts them with pleasure from your hands. ¹⁴ You ask, "Why?" It is because the LORD is the witness between you and the	
wife of your youth. You have been unfaithful to her, though she is your partner, the wife of your marriage covenant.	
¹⁵ Has not the one God made you? You belong to him in body and spirit. And what does the one God seek? Godly offspring. So be on your	
guard, and do not be unfaithful to the wife of your youth. 16 "The man who hates and divorces"	
his wife," says the LORD, the God of Israel, "does violence to the one he should pro-	
tect," says the LORD Almighty. So be on your	

guard, and do not be unfaithful.

DISPUTATION 5 | MONEY

Personal time in Malachi 3:6-12

6 "I the Lord do not change. So you, the descendants of Jacob, are not destroyed. 7 Ever since the time of your ancestors you have turned away from my decrees and have not	
kept them. Return to me, and I will return to you," says the Lord Almighty.	
"But you ask, 'How are we to return?'	
8 "Will a mere mortal rob God? Yet you rob me.	
"But you ask, 'How are we robbing you?'	
"In tithes and offerings. 9 You are under a curse—your whole nation—because you are	
robbing me. 10 Bring the whole tithe into the storehouse, that there may be food in my	
house. Test me in this," says	
the Lord Almighty, "and see if I will not throw open the floodgates of heaven and pour out so	
much blessing that there will not be room enough to store it. 11 I will prevent pests from	
devouring your crops, and the vines in your

DISPUTATION 6 | ARROGANCE

Personal time in Malachi 3:13-4:3

13 "You have spoken arrogantly against me," says the Lord.

"Yet you ask, 'What have we said against you?'

14 "You have said, 'It is futile to serve God. What do we gain by carrying out his requirements and going about like mourners before the Lord Almighty? 15 But now we call the arrogant blessed. Certainly evildoers prosper, and even when they put God to the test, they get away with it.'"

16 Then those who feared the Lord talked with each other, and the Lord listened and heard. A scroll of remembrance was written in his presence concerning those who feared the Lord and honored his name.

17 "On the day when I act," says the Lord Almighty, "they will be my treasured possession. I will spare them, just as a father has compassion and spares his son who serves him. 18 And you will again see the distinction between the righteous and the wicked, between those who serve God and those who do not.

4 "Surely the day is coming; it will burn like a furnace. All the arrogant and every evildoer will be stubble, and the day that is coming will set them on fire," says the Lord Almighty. "Not a root or a branch will be left to them. 2 But for you who revere my name, the sun of righteousness will rise with healing in its rays. And you will go out and frolic like well-fed calves. 3 Then you will trample on the wicked; they will be ashes under the soles of your feet on the day when I act," says the Lord Almighty.
