Paul and Silas visited Thessalonica for a f preached the gospel, establish this little of got kicked out of the city because the Jew (Acts 17:1-9). Having been forced to leave (2:17), Paul and Silas send Timothy to see going (3:1-5). The letter that we know as 1 comes to the church in response to Timor 13). And wonderfully, it's good news!

These guys are the real deal, they've stuc in hard times and he wants them to keep courages them, communicates his love for sire to be with them, his ongoing concern from a distance. He's delighted with their wants them to keep going.

He's aware that there are many dangers f church from the outside and from within. to destroy her and will use any means pos same time he's confident in the power of lives. So he reminds them of what he taug gospel living when he was there, he gives tions about putting sin to death, honourin and learning from them, turning from lust with each other in holiness and righteous all they can to live at peace. ere's also an important emphasis on suffering and pe. By nature we live in what the famous sociologist arles Taylor calls "the imminent frame" but the Chrisn understanding of life is very different. 1 Thessalonis teaches that our identity is found in the past and our ure shapes the way we live in the present. Jesus will urn, we need to be alert and we need to encourage ch other to press on in hope.

ul repeatedly mentions how they received the gospel in ffering (1 Thes. 1:6; 2:2, 14, 17; 3:1-4) and some of eir number had even been killed. Paul addresses this ue head on by offering two words of encouragement in a face of death but I'll leave you to uncover what they e for yourself (4:18, 5:11)

ust this book will leave you deeply encouraged. It's a ok about God's power, a celebration of a group of ristians who put on faith when things looked uncertain, t on love when they experienced cruelty and put on pe when they experienced suffering. The devil may disb the peace for a time, the authorities may even kill us, t God is at work, and Jesus will win.

Now may the God of peace himself sanctify you comletely, and may your whole spirit and soul and body be ot blameless at the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ. He who calls you is faithful; he will surely do it"

1 Paul, Silas and Timothy, To the church of the Thessalonians in God the Father and the Lord Jesus Christ: Grace and peace to you. 2 We always thank God for all of you and continually mention you in our prayers. 3 We remember before our God and Father your work produced by faith, your labor prompted by love, and your endurance inspired by hope in our Lord Jesus Christ. 4 For we know, brothers and sisters loved by God, that he has chosen you,5 because our gospel came to you not simply with words but also with power, with the Holy Spirit and deep conviction. You know how we lived among you for your sake. 6 You became imitators of us and of the Lord, for you welcomed the message in the midst of severe suffering with the joy given by the Holy Spirit. 7 And so you became a model to all the believers in Macedonia and Achaia. 8 The Lord's message rang out from you not only in Macedonia and Achaia-your faith in God has become known everywhere. Therefore we do not need to say anything about it, 9 for they themselves report what kind of reception you gave us. They tell how you turned to God from idols to serve the living and true God, 10 and to wait for his Son from heaven, whom he raised from the dead—Jesus, who rescues us from the coming wrath.

WEEK 5 | GENUINE GOSPEL HOP

Personal time in 1 Thessalonians 4:13-5:11

13 Brothers and sisters, we do not want you to be uninformed about those who sleep in death, so that you do not grieve like the rest of mankind, who have no hope. 14 For we believe that Jesus died and rose again, and so we believe that God will bring with Jesus those who have fallen asleep in him. 15 According to the Lord's word, we tell you that we who are still alive, who are left until the coming of the Lord, will certainly not precede those who have fallen asleep. 16 For the Lord himself will come down from heaven, with a loud command, with the voice of the archangel and with the trumpet call of God, and the dead in Christ will rise first. 17 After that, we who are still alive and are left will be caught up together with them in the clouds to meet the Lord in the air. And so we will be with the Lord forever. 18 Therefore encourage one another with these words.

Now, brothers and sisters, about times and dates we do not need to write to you, 2 for you know very well that the day of the Lord will come like a thief in the night. 3 While people are saying, "Peace and safety," destruction will come on them suddenly, as labor pains on a pregnant woman, and they will not escape.

You are witnesses, and so is God, of how holy, righteous and blameless we were among you who believed. For you know that we dealt with each of you as a father deals with his own children, encouraging, comforting and urging you to live lives worthy of God, who calls you into his kingdom and glory.

And we also thank God continually because, when you received the word of God, which you heard from us, you accepted it not as a human word, but as it actually is, the word of God, which is indeed at work in you who believe. For you, brothers and sisters, became imitators of God's churches in Judea, which are in Christ Jesus: You suffered from your own people the same things those churches suffered from the Jews who killed the Lord Jesus and the prophets and also drove us out. They displease God and are hostile to everyone in their effort to keep us from speaking to the Gentiles so that they may be saved. In this way they always heap up their sins to the limit. The wrath of God has come upon them at last.
